

1. Technology and Society magazine

In December 2005, T&S received three "Awards of Excellence" for 2005 by the Society for Technical Communications (STC) at the chapter level. T&S received a first award for 2005 in the overall category of Scholarly/Professional Journals, based on writing, graphics, copy editing, and overall integration. T&S received a second award in the category Scholarly/Professional Articles for the article "Face Recognition Technology: Security vs. Privacy," by Kevin W. Bowyer, in the Spring 2004 issue. T&S received a third award in the category of Trade/News Articles, for "Wind Energy's Promise, Offshore," by Terri Bookman, published in the Summer 2005 issue.

Thirty papers were submitted for regular issues of T&S in 2005 plus two resubmissions from 2004. Of these, five were rejected without review, six were rejected after review, five were given "revise and resubmit" responses (two of these were resubmitted and accepted), eleven were accepted with revisions, and two were accepted as an unreviewed feature; three others are still under review. Three papers have been received to date in 2006; one of these was rejected without review and two are under review.

Requests for complimentary copies of T&S have increased noticeably since our new SSIT and T&S Web sites were launched in late December. Although requests previously had slowed to a trickle, requests now run at about 5 to 10 per month. As in the past, many of these requests come from readers in developing countries. In the past few weeks, we have fulfilled Web-generated complimentary copy requests from Pakistan (two requests), India, Nepal, U.K., Germany, Canada, as well as several to the U.S.

The original page budget for calendar year 2006 was 208 (excluding covers). The page budget was increased to 224 (plus 16 cover pages) at the December 2005 BOG meeting; this budget change is not normally permitted so late in the year, but TAB had special circumstances this year. Based on the papers currently in the pipeline, for calendar year 2007, we again recommend 224 pages plus 16 cover pages, for a total of 240 pages.

2. Editorial Board for Technology and Society Magazine

As a result of our 5-year review by TAB Periodicals Committee we agreed to add a new editorial board member from Regions 8–10 and a second Associate Editor from Regions 8–10. We have not yet identified such a person (or persons).

3. Electronic newsletter

Publication dates for the e-newsletter are set to coordinate with the BOG meetings (so minutes are available) and with the release of T&S magazine. Items for the e-newsletter should be sent to Karl Perusich (perusich@sbcglobal.net).

4. Sister society agreement with ASME Technology and Society Division

Although IEEE has temporarily suspended the creation of new sister society agreements, we hope to negotiate an agreement with the Technology and Society Division of ASME to provide T&S magazine to T&S Division members at a rate between the IEEE SSIT member rate (\$24) and the affiliate rate (\$83). We will also consider reduced registration rates for ISTAS conferences for T&S Division members. Michael Loui has initiated contact with the officers of the ASME T&S Division and with ASME staff.
